Nova was a heart-breaking sight. I could count each of her ribs.

Her bones protruded from her frail, skinny body. The exhaustion was visible in her eyes.

<Salutation>, I'm writing to you today about a truly urgent situation.
The rising cost of living, coupled with a rehoming crisis, means
abandoned dogs like Nova need you now more than ever.

At first glance, I really struggled to believe Nova was pregnant.

I mean, she was just so skinny...

Nova had been abandoned at the worst possible time - pregnant and due to give birth any day.

Poor exhausted Nova was found wandering the streets, her stomach empty, her aching, worn-out body struggling to keep her unborn pups alive. She was hungry. Cold. Scared.

Nova could give birth at any moment.

As the cost-of-living crisis worsens, the number of abandoned dogs in desperate need of homes will continue to rise. I wouldn't be honest with you if I didn't share my frustration, <<u>Salutation</u>>.

Nova was weak, not just from starvation, but because any bit of nutrition she had been getting was going straight to her unborn pups.

She could barely stand up and the sight of her broke my heart.

This poor, starving girl scoffed down every last bit of food we gave her. Who knows when she'd last eaten anything...

At a time when costs are rising for all of us, and none of us are sure what lies around the corner, your steadfast support is appreciated more than ever.

Sadly, times are tough for Ireland's dogs too. The vulnerable, abandoned dogs that end up in our care need you now more than ever.

You truly are their only hope.

Nova was not long with us when she went into labour.

Can you imagine what would have happened if Nova hadn't been rescued when she was?

She would have had nowhere safe to have her pups. <u>Terrified, she</u> would have given birth all alone in the cold, with nobody to help her, <u>no way of protecting her newborn babies.</u>

There's the possibility that Nova would have died giving birth. And if by some miracle she survived, her babies wouldn't have.

Thanks to dog lovers like you, Nova and her puppies are getting the best care. They are the lucky ones.

Poor Nova was just so weak after her pups were born. At the vet's, she had to be given special injections of nutrients so she'd be strong enough to care for her nine puppies.

She was so starved, her body was not producing enough milk and nutrients to feed her pups, so our puppy rearers hand-fed them during the day. By doing this, we were adding to the milk that Nova was providing them through the night.

Tiny Nellie was one of the weakest. She barely moved. Her little body was so cold. We took turns taking her home at night, making sure she was cared for. We worked around the clock, fighting for her.



It's hard to believe Nova's emaciated body had kept so many pups alive!

We fed her. We held her close, keeping her tiny body warm. We stroked her, we talked to her.



when I look at Nova with her pups now, it breaks my heart to think they could have all died, alone and unloved...

We willed her to live.

Sadly little Nellie didn't make it, but in the short time she was with us, she made her mark.

This tiny pup had a profound effect on us all. Even now, the memory of her brings me to tears. We will never forget the fight to save her. It's a fight that's only made possible by your support. Sometimes, we lose the fight. But, more often than not, your support saves lives.

I'm sharing Nellie's story in the hope that you will be there for pups like her and her mum, Nova. They are counting on your compassion, on your love. Dogs like Nova trust you to help them. They trust you to not turn away.

I know I can trust you too, <Salutation>. I know your compassion means you won't turn a blind eye to the abandoned, neglected and suffering dogs, not just at Christmas but throughout the year.

Will you please send a gift of €<Ask1> so that another vulnerable mum and her pups can be taken to safety and looked after?



She just needed a safe space, some nourishing food, and a warm bed.

The sad fact is, our kennels are always full. Families like Nova and her pups need to be cared for in our whelping unit, which only has so much space.

That pressure on space mounts each time we get a call about another pregnant mum who has been abandoned.

After this call, the work begins to prepare a kennel in our whelping unit, to provide her with a safe space in which to give birth – sometimes within days, sometimes weeks. And once those pups are born, we need to find a home for not just one dog but potentially up to ten.

The costs escalate dramatically.

But your kind gift means we can give abandoned dogs like Nova and her pups the love and care they deserve.

Your compassion can save another helpless dog who's been abandoned and left in the cold. Please don't turn away from a vulnerable dog who needs you.

For unloved and abandoned dogs like Nova, your kind gift will be the difference between life and death this Christmas. Dogs Trust Ireland will never stop working to save vulnerable dogs and give them the life they deserve. But we can't do this without you.

With your continued support, we can ensure abandoned dogs who've been left scared, cold, and hungry can be taken to safety and given a nutritious meal and a warm space in which to lay their head.

That's all every dog wants this Christmas.

It's all Nova wanted too.

Thank you for allowing me to share her story with you and thank you for loving dogs as much as you do.
